CONVERSATIONS GOING ON JUST BEHIND THE WAITNG LINE.


We are a family club and social contact can be as important as scoring to some members. But we do ask that during shooting you please limit the chatter and noise.

Obviously, coaches are qualified to teach and so are AGB instructors. Under the AGB umbrella of insurance as long as you are an AGB member and/or supervised by a member you can help prospective archers at taster sessions or a have-a-go.

If you are supervised and instructed on technique by an AGB coach then you are able to help at Beginners courses if you are willing. Ultimately, we would like more members to qualify as coaches but willing volunteers are always welcome to help.

This works the same during club sessions, the coaches and instructors are willing to help, observe and advise anyone, but sometimes as a target mate or line archer you can see that small inconsistency in a fellow archer or perhaps you have some personal hints and tips that you have learned or developed with a coach. Maybe you have something that works for you that you want to share. This is all acceptable within an AGB archery club,

There is also the matter of how to run a session. It's easy, we are insured as a club as long as there **are 2 over 18year old club members.** All who are shooting **MUST BE AGB affiliated.** Ideally there should be a Non-shooting line captain with control of the whistle and total awareness of the range.

If you are interested in getting involved in AGB coaching or learning how to be a line captain please let John, Di or Robyn know. We recoanise it's not iust Archers here ! Our club is amazing, we have family, friends and partners come along for support and to be part of Griffin Archers.
