#### BACK TO SHOOTING 9th April 2021

INDOORS - as we have a high proportion of disabled members, we don't want to put anyone at risk, this means we all have to continue to follow some new rules. Hopefully, over time, we can relax these and just adapt to the current situation.

With lighter evenings we can also shoot outside!

#### Safe Return to Archery – An easy guide.

#### **Every Archer MUST Have:-**

- 1. Face covering like in any other place, it can be removed ONLY when shooting
- 2. Personal hand sanitiser
- 3. Anti-bacterial/viral wipes or spray and disposable cloth for personal equipment
- 4. Disposable gloves (will be expected to wear at every contact with target or any other equipment)
- 5. Personal drinks/snacks these must only be consumed away from the main hall and at an appropriate distance.

All personal equipment (including bags) must be sanitized before shooting and after shooting. This is the archers' responsibility. The club CANNOT be responsible for any items of equipment left behind.

ONLY archers are allowed on the waiting line and shooting line. Observers, parents or carers must sit out of the range, in the café area (at an appropriate distance, with suitable face coverings)

## Things about the Focus Centre COVID 19 guidelines.



Entry and leaving – a one way system. So, we experience this at supermarkets and GP's, it is recommended to use a single entry/exit. At the Focus Centre we can accommodate this by using the front door as an entrance and the back fire doors in the rear right of the back wall as an exit.

Obviously there may be occasions to use the entry as an exit, especially in regards to Range safety (the exit is behind the net and the targets!). Notify the line captain.

Comfort breaks or Leaving the shooting /or waiting line. – Because of the way our lines are and that you must pass other archers and their equipment to get to a target space, we have to ask everyone to be patient and considerate.

Indicate to the line captain that you are waiting to leave and they will advise when it is safe to do so. Maintain face covering and social distance. When returning wait in the doorway for an appropriate moment to return. Also sanitise hands prior to return to shooting.

Barriers between Archers at the shooting line and at the targets. – Like at checkouts and anywhere, we are supposed to provide a clean screen between archers at both ends of the range. Up at the targets you should have on your face covering and your gloves, at the shooting line, only while shooting, you can remove your mask for safety, but it must be replaced and worn, at all other times.

# Have you sorted your Standing Order? Target Fees and Membership Fees are all due...

Because we cannot (should not) take cash, due to COVID regulations, we have implemented mandatory bank transfer or standing order payments for all.

Attached is the payment due on the back page, you should have received details from Di with the amount you need to pay and the bank details to set this up.

AGB/SCAS and CAA affiliations are also mandatory, most of you have them in place, if not Di can let you know exactly how to pay these too.



### **COVID 19** and using the Facilities (The Toilets)

Obviously, we are hoping to have full access to the toilets at the Focus Centre, but there will be some restrictions. As with guidelines, always wash your hands, sing "happy birthday" twice and make sure to use soap provided and disposable towels.

#### **BE AWARE!!!**

- There may be extra rules that will be displayed
- There may be a rule on single person occupancy
- There may be anti-bacterial wipes for wiping down hard surfaces before and after use.

This means that they will all be able to confidently help every archer get back into shooting, safely and with as much guidance as they need, while maintaining safe distances.
