(Members can also attend other sessions – Thursday evenings and Saturday mornings, at a personal cost £6) These sessions MUST be booked in advance through Di to take advantage of the offer and conform with Fenland Archers requirements!

Outdoors at Thorney Rugby Club, we will continue to have shooting available on Sunday afternoons. Starting at 3pm until the light means that we need to start at 2pm. We could look at alternative times/days depending on availability. We will have a WhatsApp group to notify everyone if these sessions are cancelled due to weather conditions. But rain, light winds and cold will not stop shooting. So come along and be prepared. Frostbite rounds....have a go! (We do have access to the club house kitchen, so we can use our equipment and supplies to make tea, coffee and hot chocolate, or even cup-a-soups.).

Finally – Friday evenings we are considering using floodlights sometimes, or torch light and LEDs, but will also run indoor equipment making and maintenance sessions from October. Practice with John Robyn, and others everything from arrow making, repair and straightening, string making and repair, setting nocking points and even tuning bows! (does anyone have a power-source we could use?)

Personal Goals to consider! (It could be you!)

So, now you are an "ARCHER" what goals can you consider in the longer term! Moving up in distance on a 252 round, gaining a new score in a Portsmouth or even entering an outside competition. But, some of you may want to understand why regular scoring and shooting rounds can get you a recognised achievement.


Classifications

Classifications are important to all archers because they are the best indication of where you are in terms of scoring ability, and provide a benchmark for levels of improvement. There are six classification levels: the lowest is third class, then second class, first class, Bowman, Master Bowman, and Grand Master Bowman at the highest classification level.

Handicaps

The handicap system is a way of adjusting scores to a baseline so that archers with different levels of experience can compete on an equal footing. A novice usually starts out with a high handicap, which reduces as they post better scores. To achieve a handicap an archer must shoot at least three rounds. The system has two main uses. First, handicaps can help you gauge your progress. Second, they are also used to produce adjusted results in handicap tournaments
